## **Equity Strategy Goals**

- To expand partnerships and funding to under-resourced communities (URCs) and under-supported communities around the Galveston Bay area.
- GBEP is setting a numeric target of investing at least 40% of EPA BIL funds in projects with service areas, including identified priority communities and projects that adjacently benefit these communities.
